

What happens after the parties resolve their issues in mediation?

During the mediation process a document called "a memorandum of mediation." is produced. At the conclusion of mediation the mediator will present the parties with this memorandum listing the issues which the parties have agreed upon. The parties may discuss the memorandum of mediation with an attorney of their own choosing before entering into a formal "Settlement Agreement."

In cases where the parties are not represented by an attorney, the mediator will produce a "Mediated Marital Settlement Agreement."

The Divorce Process after Mediation.

If one or both of the parties are represented by an attorney, the attorney will handle the preparation and filing of the divorce documentation in court. The attorney will attend the final hearing with the parties.

In instances where the parties are not represented by attorneys, some mediators will prepare the supporting divorce documents if an arrangement to do so was made prior to the mediation. Some mediators only handle the mediation and Settlement Agreement.

The Divorce & Bankruptcy Center, if requested, will prepare all of the necessary documents to complete the divorce process after mediation.

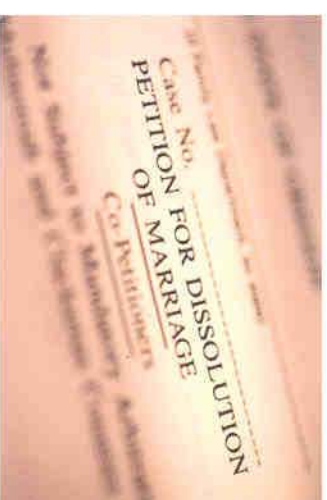

Divorce Documents Only

If divorcing couples are in complete agreement, the use of a mediator may be unnecessary. In this case, they can hire the services of the Divorce & Bankruptcy Center for document service only.
